Shri V. Hari Nair, Chief Information Commissioner, Kerala, commenced the proceedings with a warm welcome to all the dignitaries present at the meeting. He expressed his gratitude to Shri Heeralal Samariya, Hon'ble Chief Information Commissioner and President, NFICI, for giving the State of Kerala the opportunity to host such an important meeting of the NFICI. Shri Nair then invited the President of NFICI to address the participants.

Shri Heeralal Samariya welcomed all the dignitaries and members of the Board of Governors to the 33rd Board of Governors Meeting. He conveyed his thanks and appreciation to Shri V. Hari Nair, Chief Information Commissioner, Kerala, and his entire team of Commissioners, officers, and staff of the State Information Commission, Kerala, for their meticulous planning, exceptional hospitality, and seamless organisation of the meeting. He also thanked all the participants for their valuable contributions to this important platform, which promotes transparency and strengthens the citizen-centric essence of the RTI Act.

He noted that the insights and experiences shared by participants through this platform are extremely enriching and inspiring. He expressed hope that the leadership, camaraderie, and shared vision demonstrated during the event would further strengthen the collective resolve to advance transparent and accountable governance across the States.

Shri Samariya affirmed that the NFICI meetings provide an important platform for exchanging and adopting best practices followed by various Information Commissions. These meetings enable members to deliberate, interact, and share views and opinions for the more effective implementation of the "sunshine legislation." He emphasised that the RTI Act is a powerful instrument for fostering participatory democracy, promoting an informed citizenry, and ensuring good governance, and that all Information Commissioners have a vital role to play in this regard.

The Executive Secretary, Shri Sarvottam Rana was invited to proceed with the agenda points of the meeting.

The Executive Secretary proceeded with the agenda items, with the permission of the President and members:

1. Confirmation of Minutes of the Last Meeting

The 32nd meeting of the Board of Governors was held on 8 April 2025 at Guwahati, Assam. The members were requested to confirm the minutes. The Board of Governors unanimously confirmed the minutes of the meeting.

2. Publication of Annual Journal

The members were apprised that Annual Journal of RTI is in final shape and due to be published soon. He further apprised the members that the office of NFICI had got quotations from various firms for the publication of the Annual Journal. A total of approximately 80,000/- expenditure will take place for publication of 250 copies of the Journal. The members unanimously approved the proposal.

3. Reduction of Tenure of Members of the Board of Governors

The Executive Secretary apprised the members that a point had been received from some members regarding the tenure of the BOG members. He informed that the tenure of BOG members was originally fixed at two years when the Chief Information Commissioners were appointed for a term of five years. However, post-2019, owing to the amendment to the RTI Act, the tenure of the Chief Information Commissioner has been reduced to three years. In view of this change, it was suggested that the tenure of the BOG members should also be reduced from two years to one year.

The members deliberated and discussed this matter in detail, and it was unanimously decided that the tenure of the BOG members will henceforth be **one year**.

4. Status of Annual Membership Fee (up to FY 2025–26)

Members were apprised that in the 14th Annual General Body Meeting held on 8 April 2025 at Guwahati; all Information Commissions were requested to deposit the annual membership fee for FY 2025–26. The updated status of NFICI's annual membership fee collections for the financial year 2025–26 was presented.

5. Approval of Amendment in Memorandum of Association (MoA), Bye-laws, and Rules & Regulations

The members of the Board of Governors were informed that, during the 14th Annual General Body Meeting held on 8 April, 2025 at Guwahati, it was decided to increase the existing rate of Annual Membership Fee from ₹1.00 lakh to ₹1.50 lakh with effect from the financial year 2025–26. Accordingly, an amendment to the MoA is required.

The proposal was placed before the Hon'ble Board of Governors for approval, and the members unanimously approved the amendment.

6. Status of NFICI's Current Accounts and Fixed Deposits

The Executive Secretary informed the members that NFICI's current account and fixed deposits are maintained with State Bank of India, NIHFW Munirka Branch, New Delhi. As on 23 July 2025, the balance in the current account stands at ₹13,68,691/-.

In addition, the Federation also holds 10 Fixed Deposits, amounting to a principal sum of ₹1,61,48,499/- as on 23 July 2025.

7. Status of Utilization Certificates (UC) and Vouchers from Member Commissions

The Executive Secretary apprised the members regarding the status of grants released, and the receipt of Utilization Certificates along with supporting vouchers from member Information Commissions. It was proposed that the NFICI Secretariat may approach those Member Information Commissions who have not yet submitted their outstanding UCs and supporting vouchers for the grants released to them. The Board unanimously agreed to this proposal.
